2011 CHEVROLET CAMARO CONVERTIBLE

It's been an achingly long, three-year slog up until this point, but [Chevrolet](#) has finally taken the wraps off the production version of the 2011 [Camaro](#) Convertible ahead of its big day at the [LA Auto Show](#). This image give us our first view of the drop-top pony car with its canvas roof but other than that, the 'vert is exactly what you've come to expect. Both V6 and V8 models will be available at launch, with the six-pot RS putting out 312 horsepower and the range-topping LS3-equipped SS producing 426 ponies. Sales are set to begin this March, with an entry-level price tag of around \$30,000.
